In 2024, Trinity UWF has been blessed by devotional messages delivered by members of Trinity's pastoral team and will hear from other members of the team later this spring. Our goal is to nurture a closer connection between Trinity UWF and Trinity clergy and, by so doing, enhance our capacity to identify and support local needs.

Also, in February, the Executive Director of MedCamps of Louisiana presented an overview of the camping experiences that they provide year-round for special-needs individuals and their families. Through a love offering and a supply drive, Trinity UWF met some of this bighearted organization's immediate needs. MedCamps may not call itself a Christian institution, but they truly are doing God's work.

At our March meeting, Trinity UWF heard from members of the Louisiana Tech Wesley Foundation Missions Team about their upcoming return to Ethiopia on a work mission. Again, we received a love offering for a worthy cause. Our missions guest at the April UWF meeting is scheduled to be a representative of the "5 Loaves, 2 Fish" food truck ministry that provides free meals in underserved areas of Ruston, a missions project already near and dear to Trinity UWF.

The generosity of Trinity UWF members, through pledges and through donations to local missions, continues to benefit men, women, and children both close to home and around the world. We pray that our contributions bring glory to God and blessings to his people.
